

But that focus in itself is political; it is the politics of estrangement, of the person's lack of sense of power in her/himself and of ineffectiveness in the world. When what is valued as sacred is found in this world, in the plants, animals, humans, flowers, trees and rocks. in time and in space as well as outside them. then when we look around us, something that feels like love begins moving us, a sort of fierce mother love that is the Goddess inside each of us protecting her/our animal, vegetable and mineral children, wanting to set them free. So when we do ritual, we are both enclosing ourselves in the place between the worlds and we are entering the worlds, to celebrate, to heal and to make change. "The Earth She is our Mother, we must take care of Her." (American Indian song) (My thanks to Starhawk for first formulating these long-hibernating thoughts for me.)
