Open Letter to the Pagan Community

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Summer Solstice is traditionally our time of sacrifice and renewal. This year the threats to the Earth's survival grow in magnitude. Nuclear arms increase, and Reagan mounts war preparations for Latin America. Food is taken out of the mouths of the hungry, and America turns her back on the struggles for justice of women and people of color. Native American lands and ways of life are being destroyed at Big Mountain and in the Black Hills. Everywhere environmental damage becomes critical, and the likelihood of continued renewal seems dim.

In these times we feel that to claim a commitment to the Goddess places on us a responsibility to truly be guardians of the Earth, to take action to prevent Her destruction. In that spirit, on June 21 many of us in the San Francisco Bay Area will be taking part in the nonviolent blockade of the Livermore weapons lab, where many of America's first-strike nuclear weapons are designed. We expect to be arrested and to spend our Solstice - and perhaps many days thereafter - in jail. This is a very small sacrifice, measured against holocaust, and we make it willingly.

We ask you to join us, first with the support of your magic. We envision a national spell, a web of magic, of pagans all over the country working together, focusing their Midsummer ritual on the dismantling of nuclear weapons, and inspiration and empowerment for all those who work for peace.

Magic is strongest when linked with action, and we also ask you to join us in taking action - whatever the next step is for you, either openly as a pagan or simply as a citizen. If you have never thought about these issues, it is time to read, to discuss, to become informed. If you have been worried but silent, and felt powerless, now is the time to speak out - by writing letters to President Reagan, your Congressperson, Senators, local politicians and papers (Centact the League of Women Voters for addresses.) If you have written, organize others to write. Join a local group - or start one! Attend a demonstration - or organize one! Or come to Livermore with us, to offer support, or to blockade. We will help organize pagan affinity groups (call Rose at 415/626-9238).

The Goddess, the Gods in our tradition have never been omnipotent. They have always needed human help to bring growth and health to all creatures. The enormous powers of destruction at loose on the Earth today can only be checked if we raise another kind of power - the power of magic, of knowledge, will, courage, love and action - the power that comes from within.

Lughnasad Ritual, 1 August 9982

RECLAIMING's Lughnasad (Lammas) ritual will take place on the beach near the Judah St. pedestrian tunnel, in San Francisco, immediately following Tunnel Hum II (see "Music and Art"). Please bring a snack lunch and also a dinner feast to share. This will be a long day, beginning with Tunnel Hum II at noon, this ritual and a book party for Starhawk's <u>Dreaming the Dark:</u> Magic, Sex and Politics (see below).

The Lughnasad ritual, in honor of the Gaelic Sun god Lugh, will be a bonfire celebration, when we will consider the crops we have planted and the Mother will be asked to winnow, that our harvest may be good. Anyone wishing to bring dough people (symbols of our fears, to be sacrificed) or stars (to be shared and eaten), please do so.

This ritual, like all our work, will have some political content. especially when we deal with our fears.

We suggest dressing in layers, as the beach could be windy and cold as easily as it could be balmy. Bring a towel and your musical instruments. Travel heavy!


