

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

LETTERS

Dear Reclaiming,

Once again I attempt to get on your mailing list. The last cheque I sent you was ignored (perhaps it never arrived?) and I miss not knowing what you're up to. A friend showed me his copy of your Spring 1983 issue, so I know you're still around.

I'd like to add a comment (for publication if you see fit) to Roy's discussion of money in the Craft. I agree completely that if people are not to get burned out, they must receive some material recognition of their efforts, as well as spiritual fulfillment. And perhaps Roy is right that the reluctance to ask for compensation stems from "buried but undead puritanical values."

One point I would like to clarify is the meaning of the Craft law against accepting money. According to my training, the law did not originate in the Burning Times, and has nothing to do with secrecy. It has to do with people being able to buy their way into the Craft, by bribing a priestess to perform an initiation. The Law "You shall not sell the Craft" means that a priestess may not put a price tag on coven membership, or demand money to welcome a brother or sister, properly prepared, to enter the Circle. The Law was never intended to restrict practitioners of psychic, healing, organizing, or counselling arts from requesting some return for the intense application of their skills for another's benefit.

Indeed, it can be argued that unless the recipient of this good energy gives some energy in return, the circuit is incomplete and the working is less effective. Money, after all, is merely one form of frozen energy, and sometimes the most convenient to use. I hope the people in Reclaiming, individually and collectively, will value their work enough to expect, and if need be to request explicitly, that donations be forthcoming to energize them to continue to serve the larger community.

May Life, Light, Liberty, Levity and Love be with all of you.

You cancel your newspaper, every story is another depressing example of the sway that destructive power continues to hold over our lives. They say you are safer the more "peacekeeper" weapons they pile up. You go mad imagining the "peace" that follows the use of any one of them. You could lose heart.

Or, you could harness the power of despair to trigger that unaccountable response of wild hope, a renewed urge for the balancing influence of creative power, driven by a fierce will to survive.

My kid wants to know if her best friend three blocks away would be hurt if a nuclear bomb hit our house. We start naming the people we love, first ourselves, our housemates, neighbors, family across town, others in the next county...as the radius increases, I hear myself saying, yes, yes, they would all die... While despair burns in my sore heart, that other force deep in my being stirs and blazes: the raging passion to LIVE! I tell my child what I can do about our danger, I ask her to be strong and wait for me while I take action, even if I have to go through jail for doing it. We do it together, with magic we use our energy to push back the bombs...

A few years practicing witchcraft can change your life. You come into your own, free to guide your life more deliberately. Soon, no part of your life goes unexamined by your witch's eye. Then the influence of your magical practice accumulates. Finally, you gather with your growing tribe of paganfolk. Together you emerge out of the dim mainstream of our dominant culture, refusing to lose yourselves in it any longer.

I'm so glad I'm a witch. I intend to live beautifully to a feisty old age. I thrive in our community that sees the Earth beloved. We have momentum now. Our passion to survive in joy and vitality is a force whose tidal swell is forming because we will it so. We are doing it. We who love life see our common need to pool our power, to build up a wave of creative energy that can check that relentless undertow now dragging us out to our deaths...we are doing it.

We know bombs don't make us safe. They sever the web of connection that is our lifeline to each other and to the Earth. A wound in the web is an injury to all. We spin and weave like spiders, using our collected energies in a common vision of balance and connection. Our power grows as we repeat the magic and more witches join forces to charge up the fabric of life. This gathering force is our new body of creative power, just the antidote for our culture's fascination with destruction. My daughter, with the tender charm of her five years, sagged with grief, then took a deep sigh and told me, "OK, mama, if you have to go through jail like Roy and everybody." Afterwards, we won't be dying -- we can go see how far back we pushed the bombs this time.

SOME THOUGHTS ON BELTANE, SEX, POLITICS, MAGIC AND RECLAIMING

These are random notes distilled from some of the intense discussion going on in the community - some of it sparked by the Beltane Ritual. But let me speak personally here. I loved a lot of the Beltane Ritual but elements of it didn't work and other elements left me uneasy. Part of the problem was logistics. A maypole is a lovely tradition but logistically it's a pain in the ass. It requires a lot of complicated set-up and the dance is not exactly freeform and spontaneous - it only works if people stay in line and do what they're supposed to do - and I'm not sure that's what Reclaiming is about. Yet, I love the tradition and everyone seems to have fun even amidst the entanglements and confusion - so maybe the magic is working anyway and yet I always feel it works in spite of the Maypole instead of because of it. And this year, we complicated the logistics even more by the way the ritual was planned, the overlong explanations, teaching too many songs, etc. Some of that could have been avoided by those of us who've planned Beltane before but none of us with that experience made ourselves available to help with this one.

But the real questions are deeper ones. Beltane is perhaps the most explicitly erotic of all the Craft holidays. Witchcraft is a religion that celebrates sexuality as sacred. Yet all of us grew up in a culture that is, to use Luisah Teish's term, erosphobic - scared to death of sex. What's more, it's heterosexist - it assumes that heterosexuality is the one, right, true and only form of sexuality and all else is deviant. We are trying not to buy that model.


Reclaiming includes lesbians, gay men, bisexuals, heterosexuals, those who choose celibacy, those who are survivors of rape, incest, sexual abuse. Perhaps all of us have known sexuality to be used against us as a weapon. Yet we try to reclaim it, to value the diversity of its expression. Nevertheless, it is still easier for heterosexuals to be open about our sexuality, to unconsciously assume it is the model we use for our symbols and rituals. Yes, the Maypole is the phallus enfolded by the woven vagina, and yes it is beautiful and powerful to reclaim that act as sacred. But where are the symbols and visions of other sexualities? And would we all be willing to dance around them if we had them?

I feel we need to stretch ourselves more, to imagine more, to envision symbols and rituals that will not shut people out. Yet when we try to create that vision, we hurt. We hurt inside because we encounter the depths in which even the most free and Witchy of us blocked and limited and scared - and we are always inadvertently hurting each other because we don't see out of each other's eyes.

So the problem with Beltane is this: how do we celebrate sexuality in a heterosexist society without being heterosexist? Or even more simply: how do we make the erotic sacred in the midst of a culture that hates it? I don't know - but I think we need to begin to talk about it, and I'm interested in hearing responses to any of this.

On another point, the reason more people weren't around to plan Beltane reflects another concern about Reclaiming. We're over-committed and sometimes burn out. Reclaiming has an inner core of 15 to 20 people who are tightly bonded, almost incestuously so. Some of us live together, some of us sleep together, all of us turn up at the same meetings and rituals and parties. It's like family, which is wonderful. At the same time, there are a lot of new people coming to classes, forming covens, excited by what we're doing and eager to take part - and we haven't figured out yet how to expand the central core or change the forms or metamorphose to bridge some of the gaps. So I'd like to hear back from people who might like to become more central to Reclaiming - what do you need from us to make that possible? easy? inevitable?

Finally, thanks to those who did plan Beltane - Arachne, Robin, Roy, Changing Woman, Bethany and Roddy. Whatever the flaws, it raised power. It worked. It's working now - in the conversations until 2.a.m., in whatever this letter and all the other thinking and questioning sparks. It worked by bringing to the surface conflicts and questions we need to face, and because of our bonding and our love for each other, we can dare to try to face them instead of running. Magic works like a spoon in a cauldron, by stirring up. Where there's fear, there's power. Where there's conflict, there's a chance to change.



SUMMER SOLSTICE CHALLENGE TO THE MAGICAL COMMUNITY
THE QUEST: International Day of Nuclear Disarmament

"From diverse backgrounds, and with varied world views, we are drawn together on this day, International Day, to create something new. Ours is an effort that is at once joyous and desperate: we seek to prevent the destruction of life on our planet and to re-create our world."

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This is a call to action, a challenge to the magical community, a request for a very special type of earth magic. We would like you to do magic for anti-militarism on International Day, and we would like you to do the kind of magic where your body is the material of your earth magic.

During the week which begins June 20, a number of witches from the Reclaiming community will be participating in a non-violent blockade and occupation of Livermore Laboratories, where first-strike nuclear weapons are made. This is our way of celebrating Summer Solstice, of honoring the earth, the moon, the sun, the Goddess and God within. We ask of you a three-fold task.

1) Action is magic. Plan now to take action for International Day. People all over the world will be participating in local actions. All participants are requested to abide by a non-violent commitment for these actions. Here are some suggestions from the Livermore Action Group Handbook: blockades, occupations, and civil disobedience at nuclear weapons facilities and military installations, marches, vigils, rallies, street theater on June 20 (you can participate directly, or you can do childcare, pet-care, transportation, communication, monetary support, job support, etc., for people who are going to be away from their homes and jobs because of the action); conferences, teach-ins, demonstrations, letter writing, calling, etc., during the week before June 20; on June 20, people who cannot leave their workplaces or homes could telephone their friends, public officials, media, to protest the nuclear holocaust which threatens all life; begin work in your community to make it a nuclear free zone; hang banners in the windows and doors in your community; contact the local office of Mobilization for Survival, or headquarters at 853 Broadway #2109, NY NY 10003, (212) 533-0008.

2) Prepare for your action and the action of your sisters and brothers by spellwork at the dark moon. June 10 at 9:38 p.m. (Pacific) and June 11 at 0:38 a.m. (Eastern) is the new moon and the Solar Eclipse. If you do your work before the moon turns new, work with the image of a web which catches up all that we would be rid of concerning the race toward holocaust, and the connected problems and imbalance. See how the web goes all over the world. If you do your work after the moon turns new, make a web that builds peace, that connects the forces for peace, for disarmament, for the restoring of the balance. See how the web goes all over the world. In either case (and we hope you can do both kinds of work), use globes, maps and thread as magical aids. Try using this chant: "We are the power in everyone/ We are the dance of the moon and sun/ We are the hope that will not hide/ We are the turning of the tide. (by Starhawk). Send strength and power to all who will participate in the Solstice Actions. Be the Spider who creates her own pathway, her own world from her belly, her center, her will. Know how connected you are to all those who work for peace and balance. Bind your magic with a good strong web.

3) At sunset on June 20, send strong magic around the world. Everyone participating in International Day is asked to pray: "A prayer in each city and village at sunset on June 20 completely circles the earth as it spins around the sun." Tune in at sunset and do magic for the web of life; send strength to those in jail - those in jail get help and strength from those outside. Make International Day of Nuclear Disarmament part of the focus at your Summer Solstice Ritual.

May the fires of Solstice kindle your desire for peace, give you strength to strive, and light the way to change here where we live. May the blessing of the Goddess be upon you.

THE RESOURCE POOL: Reclaiming teachers are available to teach or to advise ongoing or newly formed groups. Your group can make a contract with one or several of our teachers for a class series or for specific sessions that meet your particular needs. Contact Rose at 626-9238. We will travel.

APPRENTICESHIPS: If you live far away and can spend a block of time in the SF Bay Area, Reclaiming can arrange a period of intensive magical study and practice, tailored to your experience and goals. The program might involve classes, workshops, individual sessions, readings and/or student teaching. We are especially interested in training people who will return to their home communities to share their skills. Contact Sophia, *do Reclaiming's* P.O. CLASS COSTS: We ask anyone who takes Reclaiming classes to put some energy into our collective (i.e., helping cleanup at lectures, helping to do bulk mailing, gardening, blood bank donations, etc.). We have revised our sliding scale: the 6-week series classes, unless otherwise noted, will be from \$35 - \$90.

SUMMER APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM AUGUST 8 - 13

Reclaiming is offering six days of intensive magical training and spiritual/political exploration to give people from outside the S.F. Bay area tools and skills they can take back to their own communities. Sessions will draw on material from our regular classes and workshops. As part of the learning process, students will participate in designing the program.

The apprenticeship program is open to both women and men, and there will be times when women and men meet in separate groups. We welcome students with little or no magical experience, as well as those who wish to deepen skills they already have. Advanced students will participate in teaching and group facilitation. Priority is given to people who live outside the S.F. Bay area or who cannot take our regular classes. If we have room, we may consider taking local students. Some sessions will be open to the Reclaiming Community.

We will provide places to stay for students in the homes of community people (subject to spaces available). We will assure accessibility for those with physical disabilities. Childcare can be arranged; please contact us early to discuss your needs.

In the past, we have not set a fixed fee on the apprenticeships. However, this program involves much more planning and organization, and we need to be sure that we can pay teachers and support the collective. However, we still do not want money to prevent anyone from becoming an apprentice. The cost of the program is a sliding scale \$175-\$400, with a discount if you arrange your own place to stay. We are willing to negotiate on time payments and will provide limited scholarships, or other creative arrangements.

VANDENBERG II March 19-April 1, 1983

Sunday night the rain stops just as we begin our equinox ritual. The waxing moon breaks through clouds over a field of nylon tents stretching into darkness: the Vandenberg encampment. Encircled in sacred space, we sing the names of our affinity groups and snake dance into a clump of bodies, our arms and voices rising into a powerful cone. As we ground the moon vanishes and rain falls gently.

We gather for a final pre-jail solidarity meeting. Because we'll be arrested by Feds, we can't threaten to jam the courts by demanding jury trials, as we have in previous actions; Federal law gives no right to a jury for a trespassing offense. So a new tactic is in the air--withholding our names until they agree to mass detainment, mass arraignment, equal sentences for all, and no mandatory fines. We don't want anyone singled out, but it's a touchy subject. Many folks feel it's frivolous to quibble with the prison/court system, while others feel proud to be identified by name for their stand against nuclear holocaust. Still others feel that nonviolence entails nonresistance to whatever punishment the authorities choose.

Miraculously, we agree we need not reach consensus on tactics, but only on our demands. Spoke after spoke reports most of their affinity group members will withhold names. We'll demand equal sentences for all.

Our cluster, with ages ranging from 17 to 70, spends Monday trekking overland to the Minuteman missile silos. We hide from police, from soldiers on foot and in helicopters. On a high ridge we cast a circle and call on the power of the Elementals to counteract the warped power of the U.S. war machine. We occupy the land with our spirit/bodies together with the spirits of the land and animals and human ancestors.

On a paved road at nightfall, we're joined by soldiers. At first they are nervous, but after we circle and sing they walk down the road with us, chatting and laughing about our day's adventures.

At the silo we're searched, cuffed, and bussed to a gym. Searched again, taken to an equipment cage, then to a classroom. We're given baloney on white bread, mothballed army blankets, and a floor.

Tuesday we demand the uncuffing of another group that was cuffed all night. When they come to take some of us for booking we form a tight spiral and chant. They drag some people out, but we've washed the arrest numbers off our arms so they can't tell who was arrested where. We refuse to give names. Those who need to leave plead guilty to a magistrate and are released. Those refusing to plead are bussed to Lompoc Federal Pen. Men are finally parted from women. The men sleep on mats on a gym floor. But with sheets!

Wednesday--it's exciting and disorienting to be in this big, all-male group, in jail. I see friends from other actions, and lots of new faces. We're a movement!

Days in Lompoc are long--40 minutes outside, 23 hours and 20 minutes inside. We play games, have a talent show where some of us sing "Burning Times." On the final chorus the Goddess chant soars, goes on and on. As it finally peaks and subsides I realize most of the men don't know how to ground the energy, and I miss the opportunity to teach them. A man stands crying in anguish. He is a committed Christian yet feels strongly drawn to the Earth energy we tap. He is ripped in the conflict. The entire room forms a circle and tries to ohm ourselves into oneness to heal the wound. Men talk on, quoting abstract platitudes that hide more than they heal. We grow frustrated and resentful, and I feel I've learned an important lesson about ungrounded power.

Thursday--More songs and resistance when they come to pull out people on a list. They order us up against the wall and cuff and drag those who won't walk. After they take those they want, we form a circle. Some blame the resisters for the violence; some consider nonresisters wimps and blame the authorities.

We have many long meetings over the days. News trickles in from our lawyers. The Federal prosecutor wants 30 days for 2nd offenders. Our separated friends are in Arizona. The food is worse, and many men are fasting.

By Sunday energy is low and muddled. I gather a few men and plan a ritual. About forty of us circle as the full moon looks in the high windows. Our energy becomes very focussed, very clear. We plant our hopes and dreams and visions as spring seeds, to grow into a future where Earth's life is again recognized and honored and loved. We bind our spell. We chant and dance and bond together in a mass of sound and flesh, channeling Earth energy in a spiral up beyond this prison into the sky, filling our hearts with new power. [Simultaneously in San Francisco the Matrix affinity group is working powerful support magic, strengthening our web of connection. -Sophia]

Monday the space feels renewed, even to those who weren't in the circle. Arraignments draw near. We hear the women and people in L.A. jails want to plead. Many of us still want to hold out.

Tuesday morning I go before the magistrate with the first group of 10 men. 14 days for second offenders (later reduced to 10), 3 days for firsts. Some still resist, until the whole gym population reaches consensus to accept the sentences.

By Friday all 700+ folks arrested are free. The action is over. General feeling is that solidarity was incredible, especially since this was many people's first action and nobody expected to be jailed so long.

We return home, invigorated and drained, somewhat stunned at reentry into ordinary life, between actions, isolated from our greater tribe.

THE VANCOUVER FIVE


A wave of anti-anarchist hysteria, stage-managed by the government is sweeping Canada as a result of the arrest of five Vancouver political activists accused of a "wide-spread campaign of sabotage."

Julie Belmas, Ann Hansen, Gerry Hannah, Doug Stewart and Brent Taylor were arrested on January 20 by the combined forces of every law enforcement agency in the province, who ambushed them as they drove in a pickup and pulled them through the broken windows to handcuff them. They were charged with 14 counts each of restricted weapons possession, sabotage of a B.C. substation with nuclear connections, firebombing of three video porn outlets and various conspiracy charges including plans to sabotage a Canadian Forces base where Cruise missiles are scheduled to be tested.

Police have used the West Coast bombings, as well as the bomb attack on the Toronto Litton cruise missile facility as the pretext to arrest and harass peace and radical activists across Canada. Even when, according to official reports, police in Vancouver were preparing to pounce on their chosen suspects, the cops in Toronto were busy raiding offices and homes that had no tangible connection to any of the suspects. As justification, the authorities have turned to the media to create an image in the minds of people, using rumor, speculation and outright lies, that a menace of national proportions has been halted. So bad has their conduct been that the Law Union of British Columbia has said that official conduct in the pre-trial period has "seriously jeopardized a fair trial" for the five.

The strategy of the five and their support groups is to orient their political defense around the phrase "Protect the Earth." In their first message from jail, the five (in the words of one of them) said "This case isn't about anarchy or civil rights or methods of struggle. It's just part of the struggle, and the important thing is to maintain the primacy of the struggle to protect the earth and strive for liberation."

We feel a strong connection with the five people. We have heard they have been successful and instrumental in connecting divergent parts of their community around a vision of protecting the earth and personal freedom. Our support in the form of prayers, letters, rituals, financial help and actions is very important. We are all growing in awareness of being one community and we need to act as one in support of these five people and of each other.

Dear Reclaiming,

I am fighting to return to a society where if someone needs a house we build a house. We grow food because we need to eat and not because we want to make money. We make our own decisions in our lives as much as possible - how our children are educated, what kinds of food we eat, what sort of house we live in, how our neighborhood is organized. And where decisions are too far reaching to be made locally, we make sure the delegates we send to council have no more power than we give them for that time. It will be understood that the power lies in us directly to empower or recall a delegate.

To live in this economy we have to have money and so we have to get paid for what we do in some way. But that isn't what we want. And that's why some of us instinctively put in a lot of time and caring without making sure we are remunerated. Roy mentioned that in tribal society each person will be looked after: a society where our priority is to provide for each other. Presently that choice is taken away from us. Production of consumer goods for profit shapes our choices. It is hard to make an alternative space in a world where money is the ground level value.

As well as valuing ourselves enough to ask to get paid properly, let's foster our more natural urges. If we do exchange work with each other as much as we can, we will build up a creative network of skills, get to know each other better, make our exchanges more meaningful, and begin to make a difference to the existing grab-for-profit system. The stronger the network of alliances we have, the stronger we are.
