In the past week, the country has been in quite a turmoil. 30 prisoners and 10 guards were killed at the Attica prison. An inmate was killed in an escape attempt from Marion Federal Pen, this being the third attempt in 6 months. Prisoners rioted at Pendleton Prison just last Thursday, and by the time you read this, more may be dead.

What I ask is, were their deaths warranted? Certainly they were not necessary, and as a Christian, I cannot find it in me to say the men deserved to die.

Did the prisoners really commit any capital crimes? At Attica, you say! They murdered 10 guards! In cold blood! Oh, horrors! Kill the animals! Shoot them all!

Sound funny on paper? If it does, think about the reliable old Nat'l Guard and what they must have been thinking. ("You dirty rat, you killed my brother, and now I'm going to kill you.") Why I Oppose U.S. Imperialism in S.E. Asia

The truth has finally transcended the great wall of China and made the perilous journey through the American capitalist propaganda network. The truth of what life in revolutionary China is like is revealed for all to perceive in the Sunday, Sept. 12 issue of Parade magazine. Susan Shirk, a member of the Committee of Concerned Asian Scholars, was one of fifteen who visited mainland China, and her account of the people there reveals exactly what Communism has meant to the Asian peoples.

The Chinese do not live under any oppressive government which denies the people their human rights. In China, there is no government but the people. The people are guided by a revolutionary, pioneering force which is the domineering theme of the Chinese Communist culture.

The Chinese revolutionary spirit is embodied everywhere in the slogan "Serve the people". No other words sum up the Chinese ideology as well, it appears. This revolutionary ideal of democracy is the most people-serving concept ever to exist in the history of man.

The Chinese people impressed Susan as being proud and self-confident, taking great pleasure in entertaining foreign guests. She mentioned an old woman, who spoke of how difficult life used to be and pointed to her bound feet as symbols of past oppression. The old woman was now able to serve a plentiful meal of meat, vegetables and millet. Other peasant grandmothers thought that the most important change was that after generations of illiteracy, their grandchildren were able to attend school. Also, hospitals are being established in the countryside and medics are being trained, which is one of many of the people's programs. They do not enjoy our so-called "high standard of living", but with 800 million people, Communism has brought advances to the people they would never have realized through capitalism and free enterprise.

In India, hundreds of millions are landless, starving, dying in the streets, this proletariat holding no hope for a future. Yet the government totally resists communism and revolutionary forces. Why? The government in India simply does not serve the people. Nevertheless, revolutionary ideals are spreading throughout Asia. North Korea and North Vietnam are

examples of where the revolution has spread, of where government has finally been made to serve the needs of the people. And the revolution would have spread into South Korea and South Vietnam, where the dictatorial and self-serving politicians would lose their power, to be replaced by people's government. It would have, but it didn't.

The people were strong, and the reactionary governments would have been no match by themselves. In both South Korea and South Vietnam, the government was sustained by the brute imperialistic forces of the United States. For reasons that seem incomprehensible to me, unless I think of them on the basis of mass Amerikan psychosis, (pig Amerika), the U.S. government used its mass military strength, supplemented by weak South Korean and South Vietnamese mercenaries, to forcibly sustain a government that did not give a damn about the lives of the people. We are doing it right now, supporting leaders in both countries, who in turn, do not support the people, but only themselves.

The Chinese people believe that it is the U.S. government that is their enemy, not the Amerikan people. From this end of the line, however, with the large public support given Nixon's S.E. Asian policies, it appears that not only are pig Amerikans enemies of the Chinese, but they are, in fact, enemies of themselves.

Most Amerikans are probably aghast at thought of the mass political executions that have occurred in China in the past. "This simply couldn't happen under our system of government," they believe. Let's see just what has happened under our system of government.

When our nation was founded, the southern way of life was based on the exploitation of slave labor. Slaves by the thousands lived lives little better than that of animals, and this went on for 90 years after our country was founded. In the north, with the beginning of industrialism, white slavery began. Businessmen and industrialists, under full sanction of the U.S. government, built their gargantuan corporate empires at the expense of the laborer. Child labor, the 12-14 hour work-day, dangerous working conditions, starvation wages, high unemployment--these were the foundation of our "wonderful free-enterprise system."

Don't forget the Indian. We stole his land and almost wiped him out in the process. But

all of that was in the past. . . or is it? Do the blacks and Indians have the equal rights of whites, or are they still suppressed in the ghetto and on the reservation? Does the worker have a guarantee of a socially useful job? Really?

Let's bring the Amerikan story up to date. 45,000 young men have died as a part of our imperialist forces in Vietnam. Most were drafted, or arbitrarily forced by the U.S. government to fight. And don't forget the S. Vietnamese who have died by U.S. hands. My Lai for one instance. Of course North Vietnamese deaths do not count because it's our job to kill them.

We can't forget our prisons. Prisoners are treated like less than humans, or even animals, and radical thoughts among inmates are not tolerated. Instead of a penal system, a rehabilitation system is in order. Riots start, are crushed, and the repression becomes greater. Incidents such as Soledad, San Quentin, and Attica occur. Finally, the revolution will go beyond the prisons, and the Second American Revolution will have begun.

Back to China. Those who were executed can only be construed to have been enemies of the people. During the French revolution (the revolution where many of our democratic ideals were born) the oppressive class (the royal class) was executed. The needs of the people could then be met. That is what has happened in China. We are finally hearing of the results.

These standards of course make it difficult for agents to infiltrate the New Consciousness movement. As a narc points out, "An FBI man's idea of infiltrating a hippy group is taking off his tie." Unfortunately, the narcs don't have similar hair length and dress standards.

Before this year I would have totally rejected the thought of reading about such controversial parties. Now I can give the statement that I'm glad I read the material. I learned a lot about the minorities, the individuals searching for a place to breath and express their views. I'm not ready to jump into either of these parties as a strong enthusiast, but I will say that I'm now ready to research the other forms of government of conformity before I pledge myself to any. I'm not about to be called a Democrat or Republican just because daddy or grandaddy was. I want to make my mind up, be free to choose, and after I have, stick to that choice.

I want to praise the founders of the Bull-Sheet, not because I believe in all their policies, but because they took their right of freedom of speech and used it. Their views are not forced upon anyone nor are they all thought to be accepted. They are aired and that is what is important. They have the strength and willingness to tell others their opinions. Also they are trying to break conformity and get new blood running in the social, political, and educational systems. Revolution is a change for the better, or at least a change. I say bravo to the Bull-Sheet.
